Prepare for El Niño

flowing with leaves? Does water drain off your property?

Trim any trees that might fall over during a storm. (If you use a contractor, don't get scammed. Be sure to check their license before starting work.) Clear out gutters and secure any loose items in your yard that might clog storm drains and cause flooding.

Flooding can be a result of lack of good storm preparation. If you are concerned about flooding, stock up on sandbags before the storm arrives. Quality sand bagging can help reduce the possibility of flooding by redirecting water runoff.

The City is providing free sandbags at three locations. The primary location for San Marino residents and business owners to

acquire sandbags is the parking area of Stoneman School at 1560 Pasqualito Drive. This area is open 24 hours a day and is a self-bagging station. The two additional locations for sand bags are located at Lacy Park and the Public Works Department. To obtain sandbags at these two locations, contact the Public Works Department at (626) 300-0793 during business hours. ■
